




Amid all these significant farewells, YBL Ministries has had faithful support from its boards. From the beginning, YBL has been a ministry of businessmen and women, and those men and women have carried extra weight in this past year. Through their diligence, YBL Ministries has been able to continue the mission of evangelism and discipleship to the marketplace. YBL Birmingham has continued under their leadership and with Rob Genin serving as director. The WBL ministry was served by a faithful interim leader, Amy Pattillo, and now has welcomed a new full-time director, Sharon Head. The YBL Jackson board and leadership led the ministry through several outreach events and oversaw a transition to a new director, Drew Narmour, and to a local host church, Madison Heights PCA.

With such a season of change, it seems natural to consider the story of Joshua. At the conclusion of Moses' ministry, the people had grown heavily dependent on him as the mediator of God's Words. However, God wants us all to know that the secret ingredient in all enduring ministry is not the human leader, but God

Phil Reddick had the original vision to start a 2nd Half Ministry, and as he transitioned, the lay leaders within YBL have stepped forward to carry on this important work. Phil continues to be engaged and involved, and YBL 2nd Half is partnering with him and others in this season of change.

This year the 2nd Half has grown to a dozen men's small groups! Additionally, these men have engaged in mentoring younger men, served through Grace Klein/Feed BHM, Urban Hope and The World Games.

In November, 2nd Half partnered with CFEL to put on a Caregiving Seminar. This is a crucial topic: many people have questions about how to make wise decisions in caring for aging loved ones who need help, and these issues are not frequently discussed in a systematic way. YBL 2nd Half Continues to equip men to make important transitions in their careers and to finish well for Jesus!







# WBL ANNUAL REPORT: FILLING IN THE POTHOLES JOY MOORE, WBL BOARD CHAIRPERSON

"My husband and I are moving back to Georgia."

These words from the mouth of our Director of Women Business Leaders were a shock as she and I met in April to discuss the upcoming WBL events. Our meeting quickly turned into a planning session for her exit, and my expectations of a smooth, easy year serving as board chairperson were upended as the year turned into a challenging, transitional one. God used August Griffith in her role as Director of WBL; every aspect of the ministry from community outreach events to small groups evidenced her work and His hand. When August said she was leaving, I felt as if the ministry were a runner who had developed a rhythm and stride only to abruptly stumble into a pothole. Not only was her absence leaving a huge gap, but our gifted administrative assistant also took a new job at this time.

God knew it all, and He was with us. What happened after has been another testimony of His faithfulness. The women He had selected to serve on our board stepped up in extraordinary ways to be a true working board and invest their time and hearts in the ministry. A former WBL Director, Amy Pattillo, agreed to work ten hours a week to help give continuity and plan the fall outreach event. Another former interim WBL Director, Anne Reddick, served as lead writer of a needed new on-boarding study for women interested in getting involved in our small groups. Additional small groups were formed and unexpected new teachers were identified.

For the fall event that we weren't sure would happen, God provided a venue, a speaker, decorations and everything we needed. This resulted in 220 women coming together to hear about God and to be encouraged in their walk with Him in the marketplace. God was not finished. He brought a new director for WBL. Sharon Head, whose combined experience in business and ministry make her particularly well suited for helping women connect their belief in Jesus to every aspect of their lives, stepped into the role as director in October. Sharon's passion is to see women know the incomparable love of Jesus Christ, to walk in his truth, and to make God known in all their endeavors. He also brought a new administrative assistant to help! When I look at this transitional year, all my heart sees are His incredible blessings of provision, love and care for His WBL ministry. All glory be to HIM!



The Relentless Elimination of Hurry - John Mark Comer

I am grateful for the YBL businessman who recommended this book. It shows how a state of hurry is fatal to a spiritual life. *Hurry* looks at four ways to adapt our modern lifestyles to come closer to the lifestyle of Jesus. Solitude, Silence, Sabbath and Slowing. Even the print on the book is big, and it lends itself to a more leisurely read. For all who are weary and burdened, I recommend this book and the light yoke of Jesus.

The Insanity of God - Nik Rypken

This book is part autobiography and part research. Nik and his family labored to give humanitarian relief in Mogadishu, Somalia, during some of the most brutal conflicts. After being deeply wearied by what he saw and experienced, Nik asked the question – can a Christian's faith survive in such dark and brutal places? This led him to a personal search and study of Christian saints in Russia, Eastern Europe, China, Asia and the Middle East. His eye-opening discovery was that Christians can not only survive in persecution, but flourish. This book made me want to sing a "heart song" to Jesus. Read this book to find out more.


#### **Sharon's Book Reviews**

Commentary on Romans - Frank Thielman

Not a casual or a quick read, but if you're willing to take the time and enjoy the process, this is a worthwhile investment for any thoughtful Christian. New Testament scholar, Dr. Frank Thielman, does an excellent job writing a commentary that appeals not just to those skilled in Greek but also to the untrained reader who wants to see the careful exposition of one of the richest texts in scripture. In this fast-paced world, I found great value in a slow, steady unfolding of one of Paul's most comprehensive letters. It gave me not just a deeper understanding of theological concepts, but a deeper understanding of and love for my savior.

Unoffendable -- Brant Hansen

A quick read with good reminders about how to interact with others as God's image bearers. Who doesn't feel as though they have the 'right' to be offended now and then? Brant Hansen helps us to remember the biblical truths about our sin and the sins of others and offers practical ideas on how to live an unoffendable life. As Brant says in the book, we must choose to be unoffendable before our conversations, meetings and even before the day starts. This is deciding to have a humble spirit.
